Mental Health Event Records (MHER) requirements

MHERs capture numerous unique data elements related to member care and are contractually required by OSUMH.

This information should be collected by the provider, regardless of if the member is being seen face-to-face or via telehealth. Currently, responses to all questions are required for submission in PCNX. All Mental Health services must have a MHER completed in PCNX upon admission then updated every 90 days thereafter and at discharge.

Salt Lake County specific requirements

Admission guidelines

Guidelines prioritizing admission for new clients seeking mental health and substance use disorder treatment have been added to the July 2024 Salt Lake County Provider Manual for Medicaid Services. These are specific requirements for admission, including those for programs that provide SUD treatment for women and their dependent children. The requirements for evaluating the use of medication-assisted treatment (MAT) for all clients who are opioid, alcohol, or tobacco dependent, and the requirement to screen clients for the risk of opioid and/or opiate use are also included. Providers must offer information and education regarding the use of Naloxone rescue kits (including where and how the kit can be obtained) if the client is found to be at risk for use or misuse of opioids/opiates.

Please be sure to review and implement these admission guidelines as soon as possible. You can locate the updates on pages 11-14 in the <u>Salt Lake County Provider Manual for</u> <u>Medicaid Services</u>.
